Wednesday February 15th 2017 at 2.30p.m.

Lecture: Darwin and the London Orchid Trade by Dr Jim Endersby

During Victorian times London became the centre of an intensely competitive global trade in orchids, which co-incidentally provided Charles Darwin with material for his research. This revealed the strategies orchids use to survive, thus endowing them with agency. Beautiful, exotic and strange, tropical orchids began to acquire frightening human characteristics in the popular imagination.

Jim Endersby took his first degree in History and Philosophy of Science at the University of New South Wales, followed by a doctorate at Cambridge and then he spent some time at Darwin College as a post-doctoral research fellow. He is currently Reader in The History of Science at Sussex University and has written several books including 'Imperial Nature: Joseph Hooker and the Practices of Victorian Science'. His latest book is 'A Cultural History of Orchids'.

Lecture: World Tree Story by Julian Hight

Julian Hight set off on a five-year photographic odyssey to study the world's most ancient and historic trees across 39 countries. His talk tells the story of these spectacular members of the plant kingdom and their impact on human history, legend, mythology and literature. With the photographs taken on his journey, he provides us with accounts of trees dating back some 5,000 years, others towering 275 feet into the air or those which have witnessed great events in history and given shade to some of the greatest people of the past. Following the success of *Britain's Tree Story* – his book on our own great trees – the recently published *World Tree Story* takes a fascinating look at some of the planet's most extraordinary natural phenomena – living links to history.

Lecture: Austen's Arcadia by Dawn Collins

An introduction to the development of Georgian Gardens and how they are reflected in the novels of Jane Austen. The talk, created for the Jane Austen festival, demonstrates how the gardens Jane grew up in and those she knew as an adult influenced her depiction of both the cottage garden and the great country estate. Dawn has been a garden designer and lecturer for over 20 years and a Walks and Talks Volunteer Guide at Stourhead for 10 years. Her great interest is in gardens of the 18th century.
